IMMUNIZATION REMINDERS FOR ADULT PROVIDERS

- Pertussis is cyclical and California is due for another epidemic. Make sure that all pregnant women receive the Tdap vaccine in their third trimester of <u>each</u> pregnancy. This is our best bet to prevent infant deaths.
- Effectiveness data is promising for two new 2-dose vaccines recently approved by the FDA and the ACIP:

 --HEPLISAV-B hepatitis B vaccine is for age 18 and over, with the two doses separated by one month.
 --SHINGRIX shingles vaccine is for age 50 and over.

--SHINGRIX shingles vaccine is for age 50 and over, with the two doses separated by 2-6 months.

- Continue to give two pneumococcal vaccines to the 65+ population. Start with the conjugate vaccine (PCV13), then follow up with the polysaccharide vaccine (PPSV23) 6-12 months later.
- A recent study in the Journal of Infectious Diseases showed HPV vaccine rates increasing for males -this is wonderful news. Keep it up and continue to complete all HPV vaccination series!
