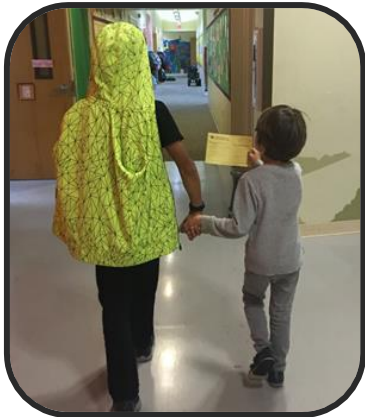
Schools averaged a **22%** participation rate (range 2%-57%)



8,522 total vaccines given at 93 schools (**7,248** students + **1,274** school staff/adults)



Since 2014, we have provided **45,987** flu vaccines to students and adults



37% of vaccines administered were to uninsured/low- income students
